### Greg Copeland Acoustic Duo

Greg Copeland and Steve Gilles will bring us an up close and personal acoustic blues, roots and soul journey.

Greg pays his dues to the originals and forefathers of the Blues from deep down South of the USA channelling this spirit into his own material and style. You'll hear warm embraces with Sister Soul and a tip of the hat to Brother Funk.

On his side will be Steve 'Guitar' Gilles, playing acoustic and resonator steel guitar, while wailing on the blues harp, also known as the 'Mississippi saxophone'.

Born in Portsmouth, Virginia (USA), Greg was and still is heavily influenced by artists such as James Brown, Wilson Pickett, Robert Johnson, Howlin'Wolf and many others. These influences have helped Greg to develop his own unique style, based on blues taking in soul and funk elements.

Greg performs across the globe and is an accomplished songwriter and produced several albums. His latest work titled *Brown-eyed Handsome Man* was released in March 2019.





#### **Culture Canvas**

Led by prominent local mural artist Cinzah Merkens (Pangea Seawalls) Culture Canvas aims to transform several prominent Hastings CBD walls into world class works of art celebrating our ethnic diversity within the region.

Working with one international, one national, and one regionally based artist, we aim to create works which have a powerful, beautiful and thought provoking impact on the streets of Hastings.

The Human Project The Human Project was part of the 2018 Festival with an incredible street performance, Meta, that popped-up in multiple locations across Hawke's Bay. It then went onto perform as part of the Performance Arcade in Wellington earlier this year.

This work is an intimate conversation between physical theatre, contemporary dance, spoken word and sound, bringing to life the real stories of migrants and their children and grandchildren. It amplifies their stories and shares them as real, visceral experiences, set against a movement-and-sound scape that immortalises the experience in our bodies. New place. #### **Come Home When The Lights Are On** Spaces>in< Between & Iwi Toi Kahungunu

A pop-up installation exploring our idea of home. Last year, for the Hawke's Bay Arts Festival, Spaces >in< Between and Iwi Toi collaborated on the poetic performance piece *Freedom is Behind My Breath*, which shared the real story of a family from Hawke's Bay. That piece explored the wishes that we have for ourselves and our whanau through song, poetry, movement and an exhibition of visual artworks. Audiences were invited to share their own wishes, written on pieces of paper, that were displayed in the foyer of the Blyth Performing Arts Centre. This installation builds on those shared wishes. We invite the people of Hawke's Bay to listen, read and share their experience of home and their wishes for their own whānau.

Do you know someone whose home has no light on? What wish would you cast for them?

'Come Home When The Lights Are On' and 'Freedom is Behind My Breath' are part of a larger body of works that are focused on telling the real whānau stories of the diverse peoples of Hawke's Bay. This includes the piece 'A Fragrant Tone of Light', that will be performed in multiple venues across Hawke's Bay in September.

Forty years ago Ricks Terstappen arrived in Hawke's Bay from the Netherlands, and ever since, he has been making art and making his mark on this region. A constant collaborator, a unique character and a perpetual connector, Ricks brings elements together to form a whole which both elevates and celebrates

the parts. Locals will be familiar with his larger public works, from the installation of godwits at Hawke's Bay Airport (in collaboration with Jacob Scott) to the sculptural

signage on the Hastings Community Arts Centre. Early in his career Ricks worked with wood, finding his way eventually to steel, and often mixing materials. He is a champion of the found object, frequently giving new life to forgotten or disused items.

Now, after so many years and so many artistic adventures, the objects he finds to re-use are sometimes components of his own earlier works.

This survey exhibition brings together new work alongside re-worked pieces and carefully chosen favourites from across the last four decades. The sculptures show a deep connection to this place, while also displaying Ricks' inimitable humour as he uses hard materials to tell stories and ask questions.

As a special addition to the exhibition, contemporary artist Ben Pearce presents work that was part of SCAPE 2018, an ambitious outdoor sculpture show in Christchurch. Ben exhibits regularly throughout New Zealand but has made Hawke's Bay home since coming here as a BFA graduate, attracted by Cicada Studios, the shared design incubator set up by Ricks, David Trubridge, Ross Mackay and William Jameson in the early 2000s.

Sroefkanelly is a word made up by Ricks' father. It means "a bit of everything". Here it reflects the collaborative, playful and wide-ranging creative output and lasting impact of one of Hawke's Bay's favourite artists.
